OUTCOMES TO BE ASSESSED:

H2. Describes and explains key features of and the relationship between Australian and international law

DIRECTIONAL VERBS:

Analyse: Identify components and the relationship between them; draw out and relate implications

Assess: Make a judgement of value, quality, outcomes, results or size

Describe: Provide characteristics and features

Explain: Relate cause and effect; make the relationships between things evident; provide why and/or how

TASK DESCRIPTION:

Students will have 3 hours, and 5 minutes reading time, to complete the examination. Students are to attempt all sections of the examination; Sections I, II and III. The task will be completed under examination conditions.

Section I

20 marks

- This section has 20 multiple choice questions (15 from the *Crime* topic and 5 from the *Human Rights* topic)
- Attempt Questions 1-20
- Allow about 30 minutes for this section.

Section II

30 marks

- This section has two parts, Part A and Part B
- Part A: short answer questions on the Human Rights topic attempt questions 21 24
- Part B: extended response on the Crime topic attempt question 25
- Allow about 1 hour for this section.

Section III

50 marks

- This section has 2 extended response questions
- Each extended response is 25 marks
- Attempt 1 question from World Order 1 Question 32. Attempt either 32a) OR 32b).
- Attempt 1 question from World Order 2 Question 33. Attempt either 33a) OR 33b).
- Allow about 1 hour and 30 minutes for this section

A sample trial examination paper is attached for your reference and practice.	

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA:

The trial will be assessing the student's ability to **describe**, **explain**, **analyse**, **assess**, and communicate Legal Studies information. Students will be required to demonstrate their understanding of Legal Studies theory by applying it with supporting legislation and case studies.
