TASK DESCRIPTION: Students will have 3 hours, and 5 minutes reading time, to complete the examination. Students are to attempt all sections of the examination; Sections I, II and III. The task will be completed under examination conditions.	
Section I 20 marks <ul style="list-style-type: none">This section has 20 multiple choice questions (15 from the <i>Crime</i> topic and 5 from the <i>Human Rights</i> topic)Attempt Questions 1-20Allow about 30 minutes for this section	
Section II 30 marks <ul style="list-style-type: none">This section has two parts, Part A and Part BPart A: short answer questions on the <i>Human Rights</i> topic - attempt questions 21 - 24Part B: extended response on the <i>Crime</i> topic - attempt question 25Allow about 1 hour for this section	
Section III 50 marks <ul style="list-style-type: none">This section has 2 extended response questionsEach extended response is 25 marksAttempt 1 question from World Order 1 – Question 32. Attempt either 32a) OR 32b).Attempt 1 question from World Order 2 – Question 33. Attempt either 33a) OR 33b).Allow about 1 hour and 30 minutes for this section
