#### **OUTCOMES TO BE ASSESSED:**

- 1.1: establishes and maintains communication in Japanese
- 1.2: manipulates linguistic structures to express ideas effectively in Japanese
- 2.1: understands and interprets information in texts using a range of strategies
- 2.2: conveys the gist of and identifies specific information in texts
- 2.5: identifies the purpose, context and audience of a text
- 3.2: structures and sequences ideas and information

#### TASK DESCRIPTION:

This task is a final examination that will cover all the content from your Japanese Beginners Study.

#### Written Examination (64 marks)

During the examination period you will sit an exam that covers all the skills and content that you have learnt in the Japanese Beginners course so far. It will have a listening component during the exam where you will listen to Japanese texts and **identify** information about those texts in English or **convey** the gist of those texts in English. It will also consist of reading Japanese texts and answering English comprehension questions where you will need to **understand** and **interpret** the information accurately, as well as **identify** the purpose, context and audience of different texts. Finally, you will be asked to write some extended writing tasks in Japanese, **manipulating** the Japanese language to **express** your

thoughts and ideas in that writing task. You will also be expected to **structure** and **sequence** the information in a logical manner.

Marks will be allocated in this examination as follows:

- Listening section 30 marks 10 short answer questions in English
- Reading section 18 marks 4 short answer questions in English
- Writing section 16 marks 2 longer responses in Japanese

#### Oral Examination (20 marks)

You will also be required to participate in a spoken conversation in Japanese with your teacher. You will be asked a series of questions from the HSC Speaking Questions list and this will go for no longer than 5 minutes. You need to **establish** and **maintain** communication throughout this conversation using various strategies in Japanese, demonstrating accurate grammar and extensive vocabulary.

#### **ASSESSMENT CRITERIA:**

You will be required to sit a Trial HSC Examination with both oral and written components, worth 84 marks

You will be assessed on your ability to:

- answer the comprehension questions accurately within the listening and reading sections
- use Japanese in extended writing tasks, including structure, sequence, grammar, vocabulary and your use of script
- communicate in Japanese effectively and fluently during the conversation.
