TASK DESCRIPTION:

You need to have a conversation with a partner (or your teacher) in Japanese asking questions and answering them (in full sentence answers) about the following information:

- Appropriate greetings for two people first meeting each other
- Names
- Ages
- Nationality
- Hometown

You need to have this conversation with your partner (or your teacher) in Japanese to **exchange** information about yourself.

This conversation needs to include appropriate grammatical structures (use full sentences) to share information between the two people. Both people are expected to ask and answer questions about all the above information. You also need to use culturally appropriate greetings for this context, and use appropriate intonation (tone of voice) and pronunciation in Japanese.

All the above information has been taught in class and is available for you to access again on Canvas. You should consider writing a draft of this task and submitting this no later than Wednesday 8th May to receive feedback.

This conversation needs to be typed and then recorded, with both the written and recorded conversation uploaded onto Canvas. You are allowed to write and perform this conversation with ONE other class member, and it will be recognised as a submission for both of you. Otherwise, you can do this by yourself, saying both parts of the conversation on your own. If pre-arranged and booked in with your teacher, you can also complete this in person at a lunch/recess break prior to the due date. The final conversation (written task and recording) needs to be uploaded onto Canvas, in the Assessment Tasks Module. Feedback and results will be posted on to Canvas.

Any evidence of plagiarism (this includes, but is not limited to, Google Translate) will result in a zero mark for the plagiarised section, and you being asked to resubmit those parts of the task.
