#### TASK DESCRIPTION:

You are required to select and research a place (city, island, etc) in Japan that you would be interested in travelling to in the future.

#### Part 1: Presentation (20 marks)

You need to **compose** and present a 3 to 4 minute oral research presentation that **uses** a range of strategies to **maintain** communication with your peers about this place in Japanese. Your presentation needs to **convey** appropriate information for this type of task and **apply** your knowledge of Japanese grammar to create your text. You need to **recognise** and **employ** the type of language that is appropriate for this context and your information needs to be accompanied by visual aids and information. Only Japanese language is acceptable in this presentation (both in your spoken and written/visual content).

You are required to record this presentation before the due date and submit your task on Canvas.

#### Part 2: Listening Comprehension (5 marks)

There will be an example of a presentation uploaded on to Canvas. You need to watch this example and fill out an information sheet in English about that presentation.

This information sheet will be assessing your ability to **identify** and **reflect** on Japanese culture/values/attitudes/beliefs that were evident in this task.

#### **ASSESSMENT CRITERIA:**

You will be assessed on your:

- Composition of the presentation
- Ability to maintain communication throughout the presentation
- Japanese grammar used in an appropriate manner
- Understanding of Japanese culture in presentation tasks

Note: Students are required to submit their own work for this task as per the school assessment guidelines, and translating tools are not to be used as they are considered to be a form of plagiarism.
