Hero's Journey Assessment 2024

TOPIC: Growing and Changing – The Hero's Journey

GRADE: A - E

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS: Students are to complete the task and submit via Canvas by Thursday 27th June 2024 - Week 9 <u>BEFORE</u> 9am

A maximum of 1 draft per student may be submitted prior to the assessment task due date. No feedback will be provided after Thursday 20th June, 2024.

OUTCOMES TO BE ASSESSED:

TASK DESCRIPTION:

Penguin Publishing are holding a creative writing competition where young writers can be published. Students will create a new tale that conforms to The Hero's Journey structure, aimed at teenagers. Each student will be given the opportunity to present their Hero's Journey pitch to a Penguin Publishing representative for 3 minutes.

Students will compose a <u>pitch transcript</u> of 500-words for a new Hero's Journey text. Students will analyse and **explain** how their story fits with Christopher Vogler's Hero's Journey structure.

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA:

What is 'The Hero's Journey?':

Christopher Volger revised and simplified Joseph Campbell's concept of 'The Hero's Journey', a wellknown narrative structure prevalent in storytelling throughout history. These stories usually deal with notions of challenge, growth and change.

You will need to compose a new story that fits with Christopher Vogler's version of The Hero's Journey, as seen below:

- 1. THE ORDINARY WORLD. We see the hero's normal life at the start of the story before the adventure begins.
- 2. THE CALL TO ADVENTURE. The hero is faced with an event, conflict, problem, or challenge that makes them begin their adventure.
- 3. REFUSAL OF THE CALL. The hero initially refuses the adventure because of hesitation, fears, insecurity, or any other number of issues. Alternately, another character may express the uncertainty and danger ahead.
- 4. MEETING WITH THE MENTOR. The hero comes across a seasoned traveller of the worlds who gives him or her training, equipment, or advice that will help on the journey. Or the hero reaches within to a source of courage and wisdom.
- 5. CROSSING THE THRESHOLD. The hero commits to leaving the Ordinary World and entering a new region or condition with unfamiliar rules and values.
- 6. TESTS, ALLIES AND ENEMIES. The hero learns the rules of the new world and endures tests, meets friends, and comes face-to-face with enemies.
- 7. APPROACH. The hero and newfound allies prepare for the major challenge in the Special world. The initial plan to take on the central conflict begins, but setbacks occur that cause the hero to try a new approach or adopt new ideas.
- 8. THE ORDEAL. Things go wrong and added conflict is introduced. The hero experiences more difficult hurdles and obstacles, some of which may lead to a life crisis.
- 9. THE REWARD. After surviving The Ordeal, the hero seizes the treasure a reward that they've earned that allows them to take on the biggest conflict. It may be a physical item like a sword or piece of knowledge or wisdom that will help them persevere.
- 10. THE ROAD BACK. About three-fourths of the way through the story, the hero is driven to complete the adventure, leaving the Special World to be sure the treasure is brought home. Often a chase scene signals the urgency and danger of the mission.
- 11. THE RESURRECTION. The climax. The hero faces a final test, using everything they have learned to take on the conflict once and for all.
- 12. RETURN WITH THE ELIXIR. The hero returns home or continues the journey, bearing some element of the treasure that has the power to transform the world as the hero has been transformed.

How do I compose my own Hero's Journey tale?

To create a new story, you need to use your imagination. Draw inspiration from the texts studied during class time to build your own characters, complications, and resolutions. Then, **investigate** whether the story idea you have will fit into Vogler's version of The Hero's Journey by completing the scaffolds attached to this assessment. (See the above Hero's Journey checklist, and the *optional* worksheet on the back page).

How do I write a 500-word pitch?


Written pitches must be short, easy to read, and consistent. This isn't the document that you want to be overly creative, decorative, or busy with — it's all about meeting the criteria, showing off your story, and characters. A pitch also needs to use persuasive language to communicate your ideas to your audience, so that they are more likely to choose your story over someone else's. Revise your understanding of the following persuasive techniques to assist you in meeting the criteria; rhetorical questions, high modality, emotive language, and repetition.

The following structural checklist will guide you in building your pitch:

- An opening sentence to hook your audience's attention. (10 words)
- A short introduction to your character's problems and how they become changed by their experiences. (80 words)
- Outline the ways that your story idea fits into Vogler's version of 'The Hero's Journey' and why it will appeal to a young/teenage audience. (300 words)
- Explain how you drew inspiration from The Hero's Journey texts studied in class. (100 words)
- Persuasive finish: Why should your story be chosen over someone else's? (10 words)

Hooking Opening Sentence: "In a world where darkness reigns, one hero will rise."
